Graduation Requirements

Students who complete 240 ECTS credits, pass all courses without failing grades, maintain a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.00, and meet all other program requirements are eligible for graduation. Graduation with a credit deficiency is not permitted.

Students who meet the graduation requirements are granted the "Open Education Faculty Bachelor's Degree in Sociology".

Second University (Admission without Entrance Examination)

Graduates of the Undergraduate Program in Sociology may continue their studies in another associate or undergraduate program of the Open Education Faculty through Anadolu University's lifelong learning initiative, the Second University scheme, provided that it is in a different field and without the need for an entrance examination.

Postgraduate Opportunities

Graduates of the Undergraduate Program in Sociology may pursue postgraduate studies, including master's and doctoral degrees, should they wish to continue their higher education.

Employment Opportunities

Graduates who successfully complete the Undergraduate Program in Sociology may find employment in both public and private sector institutions. They can work as specialist project managers, or sociologists in the human resources departments of private companies, media organisations, research firms, and in ministries such as the Ministry of Justice, the Ministry of the Interior, the Ministry of Family and Social Services, and the Ministry of Health.

They may also work as sociologists, specialists, officers, or researchers in juvenile correctional facilities, prisons, orphanages, and similar institutions. Additionally, those who obtain the required certifications may earn the title of family counsellor and pursue an academic career through postgraduate studies.
